



Grandma Anne McCarty

(Bob McCarty's grandparents)




Bob McCarty

- *Anne McCarty* was Bob McCarty's paternal grandmother. She was born in 1854 in Montreal, Canada as *Anne DiCaire*.
- She moved to Ontario, Canada, met and married *James McCarty* in 1876 at Pointe aux Roches, Ontario.
- They had 12 children and moved to Detroit in 1894. Their oldest son *John E.*, born in 1878 married *Ada Kessler* and had 9 kids: *Bill, John, James, Margaret, Catherine, Vincent, Beatrice, Edward and Robert*.

Interesting Facts About Anne DiCaire

- She has descendants that came to Montreal from France in the 1600s, shortly after it was founded by Samuel De Champlain.
- The Montreal ancestors were likely involved in fur trading, which was the main business in Montreal at that time.
- Anne's line can be traced back 9 generations in Montreal to ancestors who came in the 1500s from Northern France. (Thanks, Canadian Census).
- Her husband, *James McCarty*, was born in Ontario in 1840. His parents came from Ireland around 1835. (*Edward*, born 1821 and *Anne*, born 1819).
- Anne DiCaire McCarty died in October 1919 at age 68 after being struck by an auto and is buried at Mt. Olivet Cemetery in Detroit, Michigan.
